BR. CO. VETERAN'S SERVICE NEWS

Greg Peterson Brown County Courthouse 507-233-6636 Ban on Blood Donations Lifted. In 2020, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) lifted a longstanding ban that prevented some 4.4 million Veterans, service members and civilians stationed in certain parts of Europe between 1980 and 1996 from donating blood. The ban was meant to prevent transmission of a deadly brain disease commonly known as "mad cow disease." The fatal disease is believed to be acquired by consuming contaminated beef. U.S. bases at the time sourced potentially tainted beef from the United Kingdom, where the disease was first recognized in 1985. Under the new guidelines, persons who had been ineligible because they resided for 6 months or more on U.S. military bases in Germany, the United Kingdom, Belgium and the Netherlandts between 1980 and 1990 or on bases in Greece, Turkey, Spain, Portugal and Italy between 1980 and 1996 may now be eligible. The deferral, however, is still in place for past or recent residency or travel in some European countries. For instance, FDA guidelines do not permit donation by individuals who have spent 3 months or more cumulatively in the United Kingdom from 1980 to 1996. Call the American Red Cross at 866-236-3276 to validate your eligibility to give blood.t

Veterans: Do you require a certificate or special license to perform your work? The MN Department of Veterans Affairs will refund any money you pay to a licensing board to maintain your license until you have expended a lifetime limit of \$15,000. Doctors, lawyers, barbers, nurses, chemical applicators, food service, if your job requires you to pay for licensure then you can put that money back in your pocket with this unique program only for Minnesota Veterans.

Global War On Terrorism Veterans Bonus Update. Governor Tim Walz signed the Veterans Omnibus Bill into law on May 15th. Effective July 1st any Veteran who received the Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal is now eligible for the \$1200 Service Bonus. And, new this year, the State removed the Minnesota residency upon service entry requirements. If you entered the service from Minnesota or anywhere else you are now eligible for the GWOT Service Bonus. Contact your local Veterans Service Office for information on how to apply.


