Special Missing In Action Tribute to be held in New Ulm on May 12th. West Point graduate and Air Force Pilot Robert F. Niemann of New Ulm was flying an F-86 Sabre Jet in a bombing mission over North Korea on April 12, 1953 when his aircraft was shot down. Originally declared to be Killed In Action Niemann's spouse Thelma (Muesing) remarried and moved on with her two children. Then in 1993 photographs of Niemann being interrogated by the Soviets blew the lid off of forty years of mourning and rekindled efforts to locate the downed Airman. Niemann's daughter Ann Bakkensen and family from around the nation will converge in New Ulm on May 12th to pay a special tribute to her father at Soldiers Rest, and to open a special exhibit at the museum later in the

The Soldiers Rest memorial service will begin at 0920 near the Doughboy with military honors provided by a 21-person USAF Honor Guard team at 10 a.m. An Air Force fly-by has been authorized, but currently does not have a particular squadron identified to perform the breath taking display. The museum exhibit will be opened at 1 pm that day. The public is invited to attend both activities and volunteers are sought to help install the Avenue of Flags at the City Cemetery at 7 a.m. that morning.
