

Minneapolis VA Medical Center Offers Cochlear Implants. For yea VA Medical Center patients with significant hearing loss would trave VA to obtain a cochlear implant which is a surgically implanted elec provides a sense of sound to a person who is profoundly deaf or sev hearing in both ears. To find out if you are eligible for contact your VA primary care provider for a consult to the audiology Tricare Retiree Dental Program now covers implants.
